Agenda Item 4 - Report: Friends of Tempe Public Library

- Larry Conway, Friends of the Tempe Public Library (Friends) President, announced that the Spring Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (O.L.L.I) classes began on January 17, 2023, with a four (4) session class called Soundtrack of the Vietnam War;
 - o 42 people were in attendance;
 - There will be a total of 22 O.L.L.I classes this Spring;
 - Carrie Taylor, Library Advisory Board (Board) Chair, asked L. Conway if patrons can register for the classes even if they have already begun;
 - Registration is still being accepted.
- L. Conway confirmed that book sales at the bookstore on Mill Avenue totaled \$2500, last weekend.

Agenda Item 5 - Staff Report: Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director

- Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director Library Services Division, gave the following report specific to Tempe Public Library operations:
 - o 139 adults were engaged in programming during December 2022; programs included:
 - Book Clubs
 - Mystery Club
 - Great Books
 - Friends of Dorothy
 - Writing Programs
 - Writers' Connection
 - I Was a Perfect Child But That One Time...
 - Write the Memoir You Are Afraid to Write
 - Poetry Workshop

- Technology Help
 - Don't Be Scammed
 - Computer Basics
 - Senior Planet: How to Buy a New Computer
 - 1:1 Tech Help Appointments
 - App Store 101
- English Corner
- Meet and Compete: Board Game Playing
- Page Possibilities: 3D Snowflakes
- The library is excited about their two (2) **new book clubs** starting this month;
 - Beyond Borders: Books in Translation began Monday, January 9, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.
 with Crossing by Pajtim Statovci;
 - Horror Book Club begins Wednesday, January 18, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. with The Ballad of Black Tom by Victor LaValle;
 - The story is based on "The Horror at Red Hook" by H.P. Lovecraft.
- J. Jupitus reported the following information specific to operations of Tempe Public Library's (Library) Youth and Teen Services areas:
 - All youth programming was suspended for the month, excluding the following
 - Holiday Storytime (84 attendees plus the Grinch)
 - Kids Café (12 sessions with 62 total attendees)
 - 42 Youth Activity kits and 29 teen STEAM kits were checked out for in-library use
 - 133 participants were engaged in Teen Programming during December 2022; J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
 - Create Thursday (held five sessions)
 - Teen Volunteers provided 40 hours of service among ten (10) teens
- Library Staff did their first outreach to Pitbull's SLAM school- a charter school with a sports focus, serving grades one (1) through five (5).

- Physical circulation of materials decreased in December 2022 (-10% from November);
 - Physical circulation of materials in October 2022 totaled 46,238 uses;
 - Physical circulation of materials in November 2022 totaled 40,932 uses;
 - Physical circulation of materials in December 2022 totaled 37,226 uses;
 - For comparison, physical circulation of materials in December 2021 totaled 27,392 uses;
 physical circulation of materials in December 2019 totaled 40,097 uses.
- Virtual/eResource circulation increased slightly in December 2022;
 - eResource circulation in October 2022 totaled 30,318 uses;
 - eResource circulation in November 2022 totaled 28,678 uses;
 - eResource circulation in December 2022 totaled 30,184 uses;
 - o For comparison, eResource circulation in December 2021 totaled 26,946 uses; eResource circulation of materials in December 2019 totaled 22,751 uses.
- The library is excited to see an increase in eResource circulation and is looking at specific promotional campaigns for 2023 to help increase those numbers;
 - Freegal is becoming Freegal Music+ to help patrons understand what exactly the service is.
- Public access computers within the library's computer lab saw 3,405 uses in December 2022, an increase of 5% from November 2022;
 - The lab on the main floor saw 3,209 uses;
 - o The lab in the Teen Center saw 51 uses;
 - The lab in Youth Services saw 149 uses;
 - Satellite locations including the Cahill Senior Center, Escalante Community Center, and the North Tempe Multi-Generational Center saw 176 uses.
- Tempe Public Library has an average attendance of 884 patrons per day.
- The library is closer to launching the Tempe Public Library app, progress has been slow but steady and hoping for a February 2023 launch date
- Councilmember Garlind's Backstage Pass event will be hosted at the Tempe Public Library on January 21,2023 beginning at 10 a.m.;
 - There will be an overview of library and literacy services, have an author visit from Dave Munsey, and give people a glimpse into what makes a library run.

- J. Jupitus reported the following information related to the Tempe Public Library in 2022:
 - The Tempe Public Library was open for 2,956 hours;
 - A total of 321,759 patrons were counted;
 - An average 109 patrons per hour were in the building;
 - o A total of 863,753 items circulated.
 - An average of 30 items per active card holder.
 - A total of 93,461 registered library users;
 - 28,352 accounts were actively used, 30% of accounts.
 - The library held 290 adult programs with 5,593 attendees;
 - An average of 19 patrons per program.
 - The library organized 468 youth programs with 11,941 attendees;
 - An average of 26 patrons per program.
