# Agenda Item 5 - Making Space Presentation

- Mercedes Payne and Alicia Jerger presented the equity study for Tempe Parks and Recreation which started in July of 2022.
- Mercedes explained that City priorities 1.23: Feeling of Safety in Parks, 3.16: City Recreation, Arts, and Cultural Centers, and 3.17: Community Services Programs were the focus of the equity study.
- Mercedes gave an overview of how to navigate the StoryMaps and an explanation of the Learn, Evaluate, and Act components.
- Mercedes shared a link to a form that allows board members and commissioners to share feedback for the StoryMap.
- Mercedes explained that the group uses data to determine if Parks and Recreation have enough programs in the community.
- Alicia stated that the committee is bringing this plan to council for comment in late September, then to the public in mid-October, and finally public outreach and community events planned for October.
- Jessica Jupitus is on the equity study committee and stated that the committee worked closely with the Library and Recreation to make sure gaps in services were addressed.
- Chris Sar asked if areas where the participation was lower or the perception was lower, was this an awareness gap or a lack of activities in the area?
  - Mercedes and Alicia stated all of three of thee above.
    - 6 centers and park spaces for programming
    - Trying to reach those communities that we don't really hear from.
- Jessica stated that the City is focused on being data driven and having data behind the decision making that is pulled into the work the City does.
- Jesse Shank asked if the Neighborhood Advisory Committee has seen this?
  - Mercedes answered that the committee was show the presentation today, as other team members attended that meeting.

 Mercedes reminded the Board members that questions and feedback can be delivered at the QR code in the Making Space PowerPoint presentation or to Jessica.

- The Tempe Public Library's Tiny Art show was a success, all the kits were claimed within the first few days of release and all the canvases were returned to the library to be put on display;
  - Such a breath of abilities and inspirations, including an artist who painted a tiny portrait of the Tempe Public Library
- We have launched our Adventure Packs;
  - Each Sunday in September, a new Adventure Pack will be unveiled for the public to check out that is related to the program that is offered that day.
  - The Adventure Packs include books and items that can be used for rockhounding, stargazing, hiking, and birdwatching, respectively.
- The Library is looking forward to our upcoming programs which include Book Binding, the Arizona Clean Elections Committee "Civil Discourse", and Readers' Theater restarting.
- Charlotte Whitney will be our Resident Writer for September through November,
- J. Jupitus reported the following information specific to operations of Tempe Public Library's (Library) **Youth and Teen Services** areas:
  - 4,196 participants were engaged in **youth programming** during June, July, and August
     2023, J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
    - Hotel Saguaro puppet show
    - **LEGO Lab** (Fridays, eight (8) sessions)
    - **Kids Café** (Mondays, Tuesday, and Thursdays, 31 sessions)
    - Open Learning Lab (daily)

- Mad Scientists (alternating Wednesdays, four (4) sessions)
- Totally Tween Hangouts (Fridays, nine (9) sessions)
- **Get Inked** (alternating Saturdays, four (4) sessions)
- Storytime:
  - Baby Lapsit (Mondays, eight (8) sessions)
  - Evening (Tuesdays, seven (7) sessions)
  - Preschool (Wednesdays, eight (8) sessions)
  - Toddler (Thursdays, eight (8) sessions)
- Code Club (Thursdays, nine (9) sessions)
- Totally Tempe Tuesday (Tuesdays, six (6) sessions)
- Kamp Kool (six (6) sessions at Escalante Community Center)
- 121 Youth Activity Kits and 156 teen STEAM kits were checked-out for inlibrary use;
- 523 participants were engaged in **Teen Programming** during June, July, and August
   2023; J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
  - Game On (Wednesdays, 12 sessions)
  - Life Skills Mondays (Mondays, 12 sessions)
  - Create Thursday (Thursdays, 14 sessions)
  - Teen Storytime (Wednesdays, eight (8) sessions)
  - Teen-Led Dungeons and Dragons (Fridays, 11 sessions)
  - Teen Volunteers provided 763.5 hours of service among 108 teens
- The Youth Library hosted a gathering of foster youth and caregivers through FosterEd to share library resources and hand out library cards
- The Youth Librarians hosted a booth at TCA's Draw-a-thon on Saturday, June 24, 2023 where we talked about the Summer Reading Program with nearly 200 attendees
- The Youth Library implemented some passive programs during the summer including an egg count guessing game and a "Battle of the Birds" elimination bracket that has 704 participants.
- The Youth Library is adding seven (7) new youth programs and three (3) new teen programs for September.

- Physical circulation of materials decreased in August 2023;
  - Physical circulation of materials in August 2023 totaled 50,348 uses;
  - o Physical circulation of materials in August 2022 totaled 48,949 uses;
  - Physical circulation of materials in July 2023 totaled 51,963 uses;
  - Physical circulation of materials in June 2023 totaled 52,349 uses:
- Virtual/eResource circulation increased in August 2023;
  - eResource circulation in August 2023 totaled 37,666 uses;
  - o eResource circulation in August 2022 totaled 32,506 uses;
  - eResource circulation in July 2023 totaled 37,783 uses;
  - o eResource circulation in June 2023 totaled 36,288 uses;
- Tempe Public Library staff added 1,618 new cardholders and updated 728 library cards
  - This month reflects the highest new cardholder number in years!
    - At the beginning of Fiscal Year 2023-2024, the library had 89.145 total cardholders.
    - Of those, 50.996 have activity in the last three (3) years, but may have reached expired status.
    - As of August 2, 2023, we have a 35,003 active cards and in May of 2022 we had 20,683 active card holders
- Public access computers saw 4,452 sessions in August 2023
  - o The lab on the **main floor** saw 4,007 uses;
  - The lab in the Teen Center saw 36 uses;
  - The lab in Youth Services saw 269 uses;
  - Satellite locations including the Cahill Senior Center, Escalante Community Center, and the North Tempe Multi-Generational Center saw 140 uses.
- Tempe Public Library has an average attendance of 1,197 patrons per day.
- The Tempe Public Library App Launch has been success with 570 downloads (317 Apple users and 199 Google/Android users) in the first month and 376 downloads in August 2023
- Jessica Jupitus introduced Nora Plant Spaulding, our newest Librarian, who joined the team on Monday, August 28,2023, and joined us from the Musical instrument Museum
  - Nora will be responsible to outreach all age groups and will actively pursue partnerships.

 The Library bid farewell to Teen Librarian Amanda Takacs and Youth Librarian Dianna Manasse who have both accepted positions outside of Tempe.
