- Preserve Management Plan Survey
 - o Public Survey; November 13-27, 2023
 - 241 responses
 - 69% visit Hayden Butte; 30% 1-5 times
 - 94% visit Papago; 32% weekly
 - Hayden Butte use; 116 walk/hiking, 35 biking, climbing 19
 - Hayden Butte needs; 28 trails, 27 sign/markings, 12 water fountains, 11 maintenance, 10 shade
 - Papago; over half use both equally
 - North has more use than South
 - Over half want additional signage
 - Papago use; 158 hike/walk, 101 bike, 26 climb

Papago needs; 52 trail, 44 sign/marking, 20 maintenance, 18 jumps, 16 climb

A survey summary is being compiled. Once completed staff will provide to the commission.
