

Applications will be reviewed by an independent Arts Grant Review Panel comprised of Tempe residents, artists, arts educators, representatives from the Tempe Arts and Culture Commission and the Tempe business community. The panel will recommend awards to the Community Services Director for final approval.

Clark Park Recreation Facility

Public Art is seeking an artist to join the design team in creating an integrated work of art for the new Clark Park Recreation Facility. Response to the RFQ was overwhelming! We have 87 eligible submissions and the selection panel has begun the process of reviewing. We anticipate having an artist under contract early this summer.

Utility Boxes

Artists are working with staff now to provide exhibition ready work for display on the 2nd floor of the library. The exhibit will be installed during the last week of April with a celebration to follow. Staff is working with the library to schedule that now and will share with TACC once a date and time has been settled.

Park Play Areas

Meyer, Mitchell, Redden, and Clark Park will each have an artist designed rubber surface as part of the play area renovation process in FY 22-23. There will be 2 artists commissioned for these parks giving each artist the opportunity to design a surface in both North and South Tempe. A selection panel identified 4 finalists to interview in the coming weeks.

NEIGHBORHOOD ART

Artist Oliverio Balcells is working on designing the rubber play surface for Alegre Park while also getting ready to install his mosaic work on the standpipe diagonal from the park. Oliverio has been working with residents and the city on this process since last fall, having kicked off the artwork with workshops in the park last November.

Hayden House Rededication Sunday, April 10 | 11am-1pm | C.T. Hayden House, 1 W Rio Salado Parkway



After more than a year of restoration, Hayden House has reopened. The restoration effort has won recent awards from the Arizona Preservation Foundation and the Arizona Masonry Council. It is now home to the offices of Downtown Tempe Authority. Inside the building are interpretive panels created by Tempe History Museum that showcase significant features of the home and explain its historic significance.


Hayden House is nearby to the Onk Akimel (Salt River) where O'odham, their ancestors, and other travelling Indigenous peoples have crossed the river since time immemorial. Built in 1873 by Charles Trumbull Hayden, Hayden House is an excellent example of adobe craftsmanship. It is also the longest, continuously occupied building in Maricopa County.

In-person seating is limited. Sessions are live-streamed via Facebook and recordings can be viewed on the <u>THS Facebook page</u>.




Performances at the Museum

The exhibit celebrates 50 years of Tempe Sister Cities "Bringing the World Together - one friendship at a time." Tempe initiated its inaugural student exchange with Skopje, Yugoslavia (present North Macedonia) in 1972. Since then, 10 cities from five continents joined the Tempe Sister Cities program in cross-cultural efforts to build friendships between people and communities.
