• Tempe Center for the Arts

- o TCA has dropped the requirement for masks and COVID testing as of Friday, April 8th.
 - These steps taken based on CDC guidelines and Maricopa County transmission numbers being low. The policy has been reviewed and approved by the City Manager.

Community Arts

- Maja Aurora's position has been reclassed to Arts & Culture Manager.
- Arts Grants
 - Rolling out a new way of presenting grants with no requirement for a funding match.
 Focus on communication through storytelling to Council, including a feature in the Friday Packet.
 - J. Davis: If there's a way to communicate the success of the program to council, this may help with future asks.
 - \$200K funded 68 projects within the Wavemaker and Vibrant City Arts Grants.
 - Prospective applicants can find a Calendarly link on <u>www.tempe.gov/artsgrants</u> to view Maja's availability for grant consultation meetings. Meetings can cover questions about any stage of the grant process.
 - M. Aurora will reach out soon to TACC members who have not served on a grant panel.
 The first round starts late June.

 - J. Davis: TACC often intersects with Tempe Economic Development creating opportunities for TACC to advocate for the arts.
 - G. Sylvester: TACC intersects with the Historic Preservation Commission concerning historic homes. A prior member of TACC is now on the HPC.

NEIGHBORHOOD ART

The Cyclist Feat artwork located in the chicanes along Farmer street has been damaged several times over the last decade. In working with residents from the Wilson Art and Gardens Neighborhood Association, Neighborhood Services, and the City of Tempe Traffic Engineering team, artists Matthew and Maria Salenger of coLab studio have provided a proposal to move the artwork into a safer location along Farmer. This proposal will require a slight modification to the original design in order to allow it to fit within the new location and be removed from the chicanes. The new location is on the corner of 10th and Farmer, which will provide safety from vehicular traffic and create a landmark within the area. Staff is working with the artist team now on creating a contract and schedule for the renovation.


