4. COMMITTEE SESSION ITEMS

A. <u>Current Items and Updates</u>

1. Presentation on Encampments/River Bottom Clean-Up Initiatives

PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

POLICE ASSISTANT CHIEF ANDRE ANDERSON AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAUL BENTLEY PRESENTED AN UPDATE ON THE "HOMELESS HELP PLAN 2022." COUNCIL MEMBER GARLID THANKED THE STAFF FOR THE UPDATE AND MENTIONED THAT COMMUNITY MEMBERS ARE STARTING TO NOTICE THAT THE ENCAMPMENTS ARE STARTING TO GO AWAY. SHE APPRECIATES THE CROSS-AGENCY WORK TO ADDRESS THIS ISSUE AND LIKES THE FOCUS ON RARE. BRIEF AND ONE TIME. SHE ALSO LIKES THE COMMUNITY AMBASSADORS AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH CENTER IN NORTH TEMPE. SHE FEELS THE GROUP IS DOING A GOOD JOB. COUNCILMEMBER JOEL NAVARRO ALSO COMPLIMENTED THE HARD WORK AND APPRECIATES THAT THE STAFF ARE TRYING TO TACKLE ALL ISSUES AND HIT ALL ANGLES. HE SAYS IT SHOWS THE TIME AND ENERGY THAT THE CITY IS PUTTING INTO THIS ISSUE. HE FEELS IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE NOT BE USING PD AND FD ON THINGS THAT OTHERS ARE BETTER EQUIPPED TO ADDRESS AND LIKES THIS PLAN'S RETHINKING OF THE APPROACH TO PROVIDE THESE SERVICES WITH OTHER STAFF. COUNCILMEMBER GARLID ASKED HOW BEST IT IS FOR THE PUBLIC TO CONTACT THE CITY TO NOTIFY THE CITY OR ASK QUESTIONS. DEPUTY DIRECTOR BENTLEY SAID RESIDENTS SHOULD EMAIL HOPE@TEMPE.GOV AND THAT THEY ARE ADDING AN ONLINE TOOL TO REPORT ENCAMPMENTS VIA THE 311 APP AND WEBSITE.

2. Presentation on "Homeless Dashboard"

PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

POLICE ASSISTANT CHIEF ANDERSON AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPUTY DIRECTOR BENTLEY MADE A PRESENTATION ON THE CITY'S HOMELESS DASHBOARD. COUNCILMEMBER GARLID COMMENTED THAT IT IS GOOD TO KNOW THAT THAT INFORMATION IS COMING AND THE PUBLIC WILL SOON BE ABLE TO SEE THE INFORMATION FOR TRANSPARENCY.

3. Presentation on Limiting the Sale of Flavored Tobacco and Vaping Products

PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

ASSISTANT CITY ATTORNEY ELIZABETH HIGGINS PRESENTED ON POSSIBLE WAYS TO LIMIT THE SALE OF FLAVORED TOBACCO AND VAPING PRODUCTS. COUNCILMEMBER GARLID THANKED STAFF FOR THEIR WORK AND CLARIFIED THAT MOVING FORWARD THE STAFF WOULD DEVELOP AN ORDINANCE AND BRING IT BACK TO THE COUNCIL COMMITTEE AND THEN POSSIBLY TO A WORK STUDY SESSION. ASSISTANT CITY ATTORNEY HIGGINS SAID THAT SHE FEELS SHE COULD HAVE A DRAFT READY FOR THE JUNE COUNCIL COMMITTEE MEETING AND THEN IT WOULD BE READY FOR FULL COUNCIL CONSIDERATION. COUNCILMEMBER NAVARRO ASKED ABOUT THE AGE 21 REQUIREMENT. RESPONSE WAS THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT INCREASED THE AGE AND THERE IS A STATE BILL PENDING THAT COULD ALSO ADDRESS THAT ISSUE THAT IS STILL ALIVE IN THE LEGISLATURE, BUT NOT SURE IF BILL WILL PASS.
