Agenda Item 4 - Report: Friends of Tempe Public Library

In their absence, Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director - Library Services
 Division, gave the following report on behalf of Larry Conway, Executive Director - Friends of
 Tempe Public Library:

- Friends of Tempe Public Library contributed \$23,000 to Tempe Public Library in 2022 versus \$5,750 in 2021;
- o Saturday Connections Café (Café) hours will resume on September 10;
- Updated Café hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Saturday;
- Fall 2022 OSHER/ASU Lifelong Learning Institute classes begin on September 13;
- OSHER/ASU classes will occur via Zoom and in-person within the Café classroom;
- o Class schedules are available for review online and in-print at the Café.

Agenda Item 5 - Report: Teen Services Report

- Victoria Aguilar, Library Specialist II+, gave a report specific to Teen Services operations at Tempe Public Library (Library).
 - o V. Aguilar previously served as a teen volunteer at the Library;
 - Teen Services has grown significantly since 2007 to include volunteer opportunities, as well as S.T.E.A.M. and other programs.
 - At the on-set of COVID-19, Teen Services deployed a virtual model to continue to support and engage teens within the community.
 - 398 teens registered to participate in Tempe's 2022 Summer Reading Program;
 - 176 teens were first-time participants;
 - 60% of participants completed the program.
 - In June 2022, 50 teens volunteered at Tempe Public Library for a combined total of 528.50 service hours:

- In July 2022, 41 teens volunteered at the Library for a combined total of 435.50 service hours;
 - Teens are never turned away from pursuing volunteer opportunities;
 - Teens feel accepted and learn valuable life skills, as well as career-readiness skills;
 - Summer is the busiest season for the Library's Teen Volunteer program.
- Teen Services partners with the City of Tempe Human Services Department to bring additional College Connect and CARE 7 services to teens;
- A group of teens from Tempe Public Library recently participated in an interview panel to assist with the recommendation and selection of a successful candidate for the recruitment of a Teen Services Librarian I/II+.
- o Teen-selected programming will resume in September 2022; programs include:
 - Music Hype;
 - We are the Music Makers;
 - Mind-Body Mondays;
 - Create Thursday;
 - GAME ON!
- Teri Metros, Library Advisory Board Chair, and Dr. Felicia Durden praised Victoria Aguilar for her ongoing efforts to facilitate Teen Services at Tempe Public Library.

Agenda Item 6 - Staff Report: Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director

- Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director Library Services Division, gave the following report specific to Tempe Public Library operations:
 - o **223** adults were engaged in **programming** during May 2022; programs included:
 - English Corner
 - Book Clubs
 - Mystery Club
 - Great Books
 - Coffee, Tea, and Books
 - · Friends of Dorothy
 - Writing Programs

- Writer's Connection
- Point to Point to Point
- An Infinity of Ideas
- · Dialog, Dialect, and Voice
- Technology Help
 - Computer Basics
 - iPad/iPhone Explained
- Reader's Theater
- Reading an Artwork
- Library Art Reception with Public Art
- The Library's partnership with ASU and Edna Arts has led to some great programs coordinated by Colleen Fincke, Adult Services Librarian II+, including the indigenous Brazilian art program in March 2022.
- Laurel Plapp, Adult Services Librarian II+, is hosting a Tiny Art Show and encouraging the community to share their work.
- 50 patrons attended the Tempe Public Library art card kick-off and reception.
- Tempe Public Library will host "Specters of the Past: Ghost Towns That Built Arizona" moderated by Jay Mark and sponsored by an Arizona Humanities grant on June 5, 2022.
- Physical circulation of materials increased slightly in May 2022;
 - Physical circulation of materials in March 2022 totaled 38,924 uses;
 - Physical circulation of materials in April 2022 totaled 39,534 uses;
 - Physical circulation of materials in May 2022 totaled 40,402 uses.
- Virtual/eResource circulation increased by 7% from April 2022;
 - o eResource circulation in March 2022 totaled 28,810 uses;
 - o eResource circulation in April 2022 totaled 27,788 uses;
 - o eResource circulation in May 2022 totaled 29,682 uses.

- Tempe Public Library recorded its highest circulation since August 2021 in May 2022, slightly higher than May/June/July 2021; the Library is optimistic about Summer Reading.
- **Physical circulation** broke 40,000 for the first time since the on-set of the pandemic (February 2020: 42,728), which is thrilling to see.
- The Library registered more than **2,300 new users** in May 2022.
- Public access computers within the Library's computer lab saw 3,320 uses in May 2022, a slight increase from April 2022;
 - The lab on the main floor saw 2,781 uses;
 - o The lab in the **Teen Center** saw 45 uses;
 - The lab in Youth Services saw 180 uses;
 - Satellite locations including the Cahill Senior Center, Escalante Community Center, and the North Tempe Multi-Generational Center saw 314 uses, an increase of 34%.
- Tempe Public Library has an average attendance of 865 patrons per day, an increase of 6% from April 2022.
- Tempe Public Library has the following active recruitment:
 - Librarian I/II+ assigned to Youth and Teen Services;
 - The first found of interviews is scheduled to occur on 6/6.
 - Part-time, temporary Library Assistants assigned to Support Services and Shelf Maintenance;
 - Three (3) assistants are currently being processed as new hires;
 - The Shelf Maintenance team added one member and is now full.
- J. Jupitus reported the following information specific to operations of Tempe Public Library's (Library) Youth and Teen Services areas:
 - 775 participants were engaged in **youth programming** during May 2022; J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
 - Code Club, a club for youth ages six to 11-years-old to explore programming language and more, met four times;
 - Family Story Time (eight sessions; 85 attendees at each);
 - We Are the Music Makers;
 - LEGO Lab (three sessions);

- Healthy Eating with the Mayor Story Time;
- 59 Youth Activity Kits and 20 teen STEAM kits were checked-out for in-library use.
- 73 participants were engaged in teen programming during May 2022; J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
 - Anime Streamers, teen-led meetups for Anime/Manga fans met four times;
 - Game On, free play video games and socialization, held four sessions;
 - Create Thursday, teen-led, pop-up makerspace activities, occurred four times;
 - Zoom Hangouts (four sessions);
- o **Teen Volunteers** provided 71 hours of service among 20 teens.
- Virtual programming for teens continues; Teen Times and weekly Zoom Teen Hangouts continue to see a handful of participants each month.
- Two new Summer Reading Storywalks, Mable A Mermaid Fable at Escalante Multi-Generational Center and Crab Cake at Arizona Mills Mall have been installed.
- Tempe Public Library has been transformed; the entire Library looks like it is underwater.
 Summer Reading begins today; June 1, and there are already 1,300 registered participants.
- o In the last two (2) months of **outreach**, the Library team has engaged with more than 30,000 elementary school-age students and over 300 middle school-age youth.
- Tempe Public Library will play host to **Totally Tempe Tuesdays** every Tuesday at 2 p.m. through the end of July. The program has themes appropriate for all ages, and kicks-off with a Scholastic Book Fair on June 7.
