Agenda Item 5 - Report: Adult Services Report

- Colleen Fincke, Librarian II+, gave a report specific to Adult Services programming at Tempe Public Library (Library).
 - C. Fincke announced the following new programs for adults at the Library;
 - Interview with horror author Clay Mcleod Chapman on October 4 specific to his new book, "Ghost Eaters," available on YouTube;
 - An evening with AZ Paranormal Investigations and Research Society at 6:30 p.m. on October 12;
 - A Halloween Poetry Workshop with Austin Davis at 1 p.m. on October 15;
 - Creature Feature: Bats with Arizona Game and Fish at 2 p.m. on October 30;
 - Tempe's Got Talent! at 1 p.m. on April 22.
 - C. Fincke further announced the following AZ Speaks program hosted by speakers from Arizona Humanities and other cultural, educational, and nonprofit organizations:
 - The Underground and Overground Railroad presented by Dr. Tamika Sanders at 2 p.m. on February 5.
 - Teri Metros, Library Advisory Board Chair, and Dr. Felicia Durden praised Colleen Fincke for her ongoing efforts to facilitate Adult Services programming at Tempe Public Library.

Agenda Item 6 - Staff Report: Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director

- Jessica Jupitus, Deputy Community Services Director Library Services Division, gave the following report specific to Tempe Public Library operations:
 - 275 adults were engaged in programming during September 2022; programs included:

- Jigsaw Puzzle Tournament
- The Library is bringing in more gaming and social events with its Meet and Compete night and its Jigsaw Puzzle Tournament; 49 patrons attended and the winning team completed its 500piece puzzle in 48 minutes and 28 seconds.
- The **Plant Swap** and **Meet and Compete** were first time attempts and had 27 and eight attendees, respectively.
- The first series of recycled book art programs called Page Possibilities will be held on the first Saturdays of the next three months; the programs will create Halloween Garlands, Turkey

Centerpieces, and Snowflakes.

- Physical circulation of materials decreased slightly in September 2022 (-8% from August);
 - Physical circulation of materials in July 2022 totaled 49,579 uses;
 - Physical circulation of materials in August 2022 totaled 49,096 uses;
 - Physical circulation of materials in September 2022 totaled 45,200 uses;
 - For comparison, physical circulation of materials in September 2021 totaled 31,345 uses.
- Virtual/eResource circulation decreased by 7% from August 2022;
 - o eResource circulation in July 2022 totaled 31,652 uses;
 - o eResource circulation in August 2022 totaled 32,506 uses;
 - o eResource circulation in September 2022 totaled 30,456 uses;
 - For comparison, eResource circulation in September 2021 totaled 27,381 uses.
- As expected, circulation slowed after the Summer Reading boom of access but the numbers remain strong;
 - Tempe Public Library registered just under 1,300 new patrons in September (for National Library Card Sign-Up Month) and renewed/updated 863 cards;
 - o Previously, renewed and updated cards were outnumbering new cards;
 - Summer Reading and Tempe Public Library marketing efforts are paying off.
- Public access computers within the Library's computer lab saw 3,582 uses in September 2022, a slight decrease of 4% from August 2022;
 - The lab on the main floor saw 3,182 uses;
 - The lab in the Teen Center saw 25 uses:
 - The lab in Youth Services saw 179 uses;
 - Satellite locations including the Cahill Senior Center, Escalante Community Center, and the North Tempe Multi-Generational Center saw 196 uses.
- Tempe Public Library has an **average attendance** of 1,021 patrons per day, almost identical to the counts from July and August 2022.
- The Library recently purchased a Short Edition short story machine that generates one, three, or five-minute stories at the press of a button;

- Tempe Public Library is partnering with the new SLAM school to connect its students with Library cards, and to the Library;
 - o Tempe Public Library continues to seek new ways to support students and teachers.
- New water fountains with bottle fillers are being installed in the Library.
- J. Jupitus reported the following information specific to operations of Tempe Public Library's (Library) Youth and Teen Services areas:
 - 1,018 participants were engaged in youth programming during September 2022; J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
 - Code Club, a club for youth ages six to 11-years-old to explore programming language and more, met four times;
 - Baby Lap Sit Story Time (Mondays; three sessions);
 - Evening Story Time (Tuesdays; four sessions);
 - Preschool Story Time (Wednesdays; four sessions);
 - Toddler Story Time (Thursdays; four sessions).
 - We Are the Music Makers (four sessions);
 - LEGO Lab (seven sessions);
 - 70 Youth Activity Kits and 25 teen STEAM kits were checked-out for in-library use.
 - 172 participants were engaged in teen programming during September 2022; J. Jupitus highlighted the following programs:
 - Game On, free play video games and socialization, held four sessions;
 - Create Thursday, teen-led, pop-up makerspace activities, occurred five times;
 - Zoom Hangouts (four sessions);
 - Mind-Body Mondays (three sessions);
 - MusicHype (three sessions);
 - Teen Volunteer Orientation.
 - o **Teen Volunteers** provided 166.5 hours of service among 11 teens.
 - Virtual programming for teens continues; Teen Times and weekly Zoom Teen Hangouts continue to see a handful of participants each month.

- Approximately 40 patrons attended the first evening Story Time, and attendance has not slowed, averaging 66 people per Story Time event.
- o Tempe Public Library played host to two Library tours for school-age children;
- In the last two (2) months of **outreach**, the Library team has engaged with 120+ students from Meyer Montessori and worked with homeschool families to plan for student tours in October 2022.
